Some ideas for religious education in the nursery can include:
 creative play, make-believe, role play, dance and drama
 dressing up and acting out scenes from stories, celebrations or festivals
 making and eating festival food
• talking and listening to each other; hearing and discussing stories of all kinds, including religious and secular stories with themes such as goodness,
difference, the inner world of thoughts and feelings, and imagination
 exploring authentic religious artefacts, including those designed for small children such as 'soft toy' artefacts or story books
 seeing pictures, books and videos of places of worship and meeting believers in class
 listening to religious music
 starting to introduce religious terminology
 work on nature, growing and life cycles or harvest
• seizing opportunities spontaneously or linking with topical, local events such as celebrations, festivals, the birth of a new baby, weddings or the death of a
pet
 starting to talk about the different ways in which people believe and behave, and encouraging children to ask questions.
