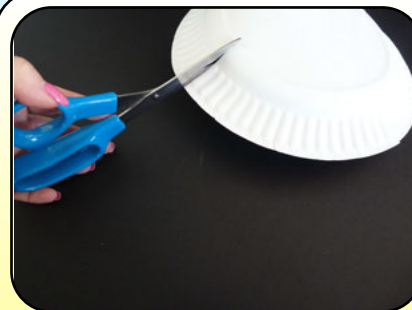
How to make an Easter bonnet



You will need: 2 paper plates, glue, scissors, stapler, ribbon and decorations.



1. Cut out the centre of one of your plates. You will then be left with a rim.



2. Cut four slits in your second plate. One on each side.



3. Overlap the edges before stapling them together. You should now have a bowl shape.



4. Place the first plate over the second and push down to make it secure.



5. Decorate your bonnet with tissue paper and other decorations.



6. Attach a ribbon to each side of your bonnet to help secure it to your head.
